

**License to Use The Feldenkrais product
that that you purchased from Ryan C. Nagy, MA.**

Freedom to use the work itself. You may use it for personal, educational, commercial, political, or religious purposes.

Freedom to build on it and adapt it for your own teaching, research or other activities.

Freedom to make and create remixes and other derivatives for any purpose. You can edit, remix, and transform however you want, and share those remixed copies. This includes the freedom to develop any class, workshop or related product that you want to teach or sell.

If you are part of a study group or small group of practitioners feel free to make copies for your study sessions.

Commercial Use

Please do not sell or give away copies of the original audio files or transcripts. They are copyrighted and belong to Ryan C. Nagy.

Ryan, like you, needs to make a living, has bills to pay and needs motivation (i.e income) to continue to have resources to create more Feldenkrais-based products.

That being said, as noted above, you can build upon, translate, re-record or “mashup” how you choose to. And you can share those remixed works freely, or sell them, incorporate them in your own teaching, method (Feldenkrais or otherwise) as you chose.

Attribution to Ryan

Attribution would be great. Most of us like to be recognized. But attribution of where you purchased the sessions (i.e. from Ryan Nagy) or got a particular idea is not a requirement. Again, I would like to be attributed. But it is not a requirement. It is not a legal requirement. And it is certainly not a moral nor ethical requirement as far as I am concerned. If you have other ideas about the ethics or morality of attribution, feel free to follow your conscience.

Note About Feldenkrais Service Marks.

I do not own, rent or otherwise take part in any of the Feldenkrais licensing schemes that exist in the world today. Nor do I personally use Feldenkrais trademarks nor service marks of any kind.

If you are working as a massage therapist, physical therapist, doctor, Rolfer, Alexander Technique or other health practitioner (or any field really) there are legal restrictions on how you can market and describe your workshops or other products that you create from

the sessions and transcripts that you bought. As a general rule simply do not use any trademarked term that you do not have the legal right to use. Please check with any regulatory body that applies to your local economy.

However, remember that ideas are not copyrightable and you can use the ideas contained in the products that you purchased from Ryan, however you chose to, pursuant to local laws and regulations.

Attribution To Feldenkrais

Attribution to Moshe Feldenkrais would be great. I personally do my best to attribute where I get Feldenkrais sessions and ideas from. However, I do not always do so. And I maintain the right to not to do so. My main concern is with the student and his or her needs. Most people would benefit from knowing that Moshe Feldenkrais was the source of an idea or lesson. But not all will. And using service marked terms and even the work “Feldenkrais” itself can be an impediment to learning. You will need to choose based on your own circumstances and that of the people you want to help.

To repeat: attribution that you are using Feldenkrais ideas is not a requirement. It would potentially be a nice thing to do and it could be useful (or not) for marketing purposes. But it is not a requirement. It is not a legal requirement. And it is certainly not a moral nor ethical requirement as far as I am concerned.
